# The Patterson Papers By Nancy-Lou Patterson Edited by Emily E. Auger and Janet Brennan Croft


The Patterson Papers: Inklings of Lewis, Williams, and Sayers collects the works of prolific scholar Nancy-Lou Patterson, active primarily in the 1980s and 1990s. Most of the essays first appeared in the journal *Mythlore* but are supplemented by articles that were unpublished or published in other journals and newsletters that are now difficult to obtain. Patterson also continued to revise many of her essays after publication. Her writing is clear, refreshing, wide-ranging, and as rich and stimulating as when these essays were first written. All of the volumes include Patterson's own illustrations, except *Divining Tarot*, for which illustrations were provided by *Mythlore* artists Patrick H. Wynne, Sarah Beach, and Bonnie Callahan. Each volume includes a bibliography and extensive index.






